AN INVITATION FROM TRINITY HOSPICE

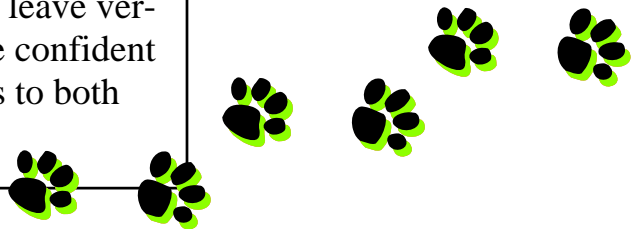

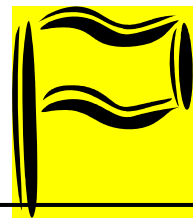
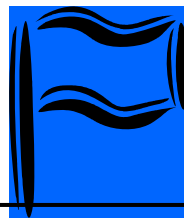
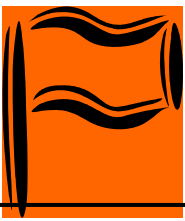
A blue bicycle belonging to Tommy (2H) has disappeared from the playground. Please check that you have not taken it.
